Alexey Brodovitch was born in Ogolichi, Оголичи Aholičy, Russian Empire (now Belarus) to a wealthy Polish family in 1898. His father, Cheslau or Vyacheslav Brodovitch, was a respected physician, psychiatrist and huntsman. His mother was an amateur painter.

After fighting in the Russian army in World War I, Brodovitch worked as a graphic designer in Paris from 1920 until 1930, when he moved to New York City.

To Alexey Brodovitch it was clear that he wanted to bring styles learnt from his time in the cosmopolitan city of Paris; surrounded by artists working in everything from Dada in Zurich and Berlin, Suprematism from Moscow, the German Bauhaus school, Italian Futurism, De Stijl from the Netherlands, to more obvious French movements of Cubism, Fauvism, Surrealism and Purism.
