Anticipation/Reaction Guide - Reading Educator

Follow these steps to create an Anticipation/Reaction Guide: Identify major concepts or "big ideas" you want students to learn from the text. Create four to six statements that support or challenge students' beliefs about the topic. Share the guide with students and ask them to Agree or Disagree ...

Anticipation/Reaction Guide - ALL-ED

The Anticipation-Reaction Guide template provides an organizational structure that guides students as they read and analyze the text passage. Teachers can use this guide to: Activate students' background knowledge before reading; Help them identify textual evidence during reading; Help them to evaluate their own and one or more author's perspectives after reading; To prepare the guide, the teacher reviews the curricular materials and identifies key concepts or themes.

An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic.

The reaction portion of an anticipation-reaction guide activity requires students to come to final conclusions about what the text actually states as the answer to the questions provided on the anticipation-reaction guide. Students get to ask themselves questions such as, "Did I guess right?" "Was my initial guess confirmed?"

Definition/Description: An anticipation guide is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and get students excited and curious about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to the teacher or another student state key ideas about the concepts in the text. They can also read several statements about the key concepts presented in the text.

Anticipation Guide - STRATEGIES

Anticipation Guide. This comprehension strategy activates students' prior knowledge, builds curiosity about a new topic before learning about it, and then checks for understanding after the topic is presented. Before beginning the lesson, students listen to or read several statements about key concepts within the new content and choose whether they agree or disagree.

Anticipation Guide - Reading Rockets

Anticipation/Reaction Guides activate students' prior knowledge. Teachers are able to focus on inaccuracies and misconceptions prior to reading. Anticipation/Reaction Guides set a purpose for reading: to accept, reject, or modify attitudes and schema (prior knowledge) during reading.
