Neonatal resuscitation: Steps and process There is no need to slap the infant; rubbing the back two or three times in addition to thorough drying is enough for stimulation. A. Airway Keep the infant's head in a slightly extended position to open the airway. Do not suction routinely.

- Resuscitation of newborns greater than or equal to 35 weeks' gestation begins with 21% oxygen (room air). Resuscitation of newborns less than 35 weeks' gestation begins with 21% to 30% oxygen.
- If a baby is breathing but oxygen saturation (SpO₂) is not within target range, free-flow oxygen administration may begin at 30%.

Maternity and Neonatal Clinical Guideline

- Refer to neonatal unit for further assessment and care (p. 23) see Charts on Care of sick and small newborns
- Breastfeed or give EBM 3ml/kg every hour by cup for 6 hours
- Check blood glucose every hour for 6 hours
- If low glucose treat for low glucose (p. 12)
- Administer Vitamin K 1mg IM
- Administer Chloramphenicol eye
