Nevertheless, Alexander Wendt is the best-known advocate of social constructivism in the field of international relations. Wendt's 1992 article "Anarchy is What States Make of It: the Social Construction of Power Politics" published in *International Organization* laid the theoretical groundwork for challenging what he considered to be a flaw shared by both neorealists and neoliberal institutionalists, namely, a commitment to a (crude) form of materialism.

Regarding the principle of determining national interests, previous mainstream theories of international relations insisted that national interests are premised on material factors (Ibid, 98-109). But Wendt's constructivism believes that national interests are constructed by shared ideas, rather than material factors.

Alexander Wendt, (born 1958, Mainz, West Germany), German-born American political scientist and educator, one of the most-influential theorists of the social-constructivist approach to the study of international relations. Wendt was a graduate of Macalester College (B.A. 1982) and obtained a Ph.D. from the University of Minnesota in 1989.

Constructivist theory emerged in the mid-1990s as a serious challenge to the dominant realist and liberal theoretical paradigms. The theory was not popularized until Wendt 1992 (cited under Alexander Wendt) (a direct challenge to neorealism) and Katzenstein 1996 (cited under Identity) made it a staple of international relations (IR) syllabi around the world.

The core of Alexander Wendt's theorization of international politics consists in his intellectual endeavour to develop a theory of the international system as a "social construction," which lies in stark contrast to the positivist and materialist conceptions of IR as theorized particularly by realists and liberalists.

The Thrust of Wendtian Constructivism

The basic insight behind the constructivist approach can be understood by unpacking a quick observation made by Alexander Wendt. He says that "500 British nuclear weapons are less threatening to the United States than 5 North Korean nuclear weapons" (Wendt 1995, 73).

Constructivism begins with the premise that international relations are socially constructed and that states behave more on the basis of the identity of other states than on their material resources. In an excerpt from *International Relations Theory*, Sarina Theys, citing Alexander Wendt, explained constructivism as follows:

Constructivism Alexander Wendt in his work entitled *Social Theory of International Politics* (1999) explain the basic propositions of constructivism, arguing that "structures of human association are determined primarily by shared ideas rather than material forces; thus, identities and interests of purposive actors are constructed by these shared ideas rather than given by nature" (Palan, 2000, p. 576).

Alexander Wendt clarifies the central claims of the constructivist approach, presenting a structural and idealist worldview which contrasts with the individualism and materialism which underpins much mainstream international relations theory.
