You'll want to address your letter to a particular person, briefly state what your proposal asks for, and summarize your program. Keep in mind that this will be your first opportunity to connect with the people who can fund your grant. Make them care about your mission.

This is very important as it will guide you in your brainstorming. In the process jot down your strong points coupled with examples. Prepare a summary statement.

Make them cry! Incorporate a case study of a real client your organization has served. Of course, change the name for confidentiality reasons. Show a real need of a real person. Take advantage of online dictionaries and thesauruses to expand your command of new words and capture the grant decision maker’s attention.

Follow exactly the headings and content requirements established by the granting agency’s call for proposals. Grant proposals are direct and to-the-point. This isn’t a good place for you to embroider your prose with flowery metaphors or weave in subtle literary allusions. Your language should be uncluttered and concise.

Keep the team to five or six members at a maximum. Too many voices can create distractions, reduce focus, and slow the entire grant writing process. Most importantly, prioritize diverse perspectives on your grant writing team to strengthen your appeal and create a more robust and flexible plan.

Always keep in mind that the key to writing a successful grant proposal is being able to sell your idea, and convince the reviewer of the importance of your project. Also keep in mind that writing a good proposal takes time and cannot be done overnight. Many proposals fail because they are written too hastily.

GUIDELINES FOR WRITING GRANT PROPOSALS

Write a clear topic sentence for each paragraph with one main point or idea. This is key for readability. Make your points as direct as possible. Avoid jargon or excessive language. Write simple and clear sentences, keeping to about 20 words or less in each. Be consistent with terms, references and writing style.

Writing successful grant applications is a long process that begins with an idea. Although many people think of grant writing as a linear process (from idea to proposal to award), it is a circular process. Diagram 1 below provides an overview of the grant writing process and may help you plan your proposal development.

Grant Proposals (or Give me the money!) - The Writing ...

Start the grant report off on the right note by addressing it to the person listed on the award letter. The award letter may provide direction for who you should submit the grant report to. If it does not, submit the grant report to the person who signed the grant letter. This may be an officer/trustee of the foundation.
