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Pitfalls. Dismissing the pelvic pain associated with PID for dysmenorrhea. Assuming a positive UA excludes the diagnosis of PID (beware sterile pyuria) Failing to do a pelvic exam and STI testing on a woman with lower abdominal pain. References / Further Reading.
