Similar to the pentagon, which has 5 sides, the pentatonic scale is a 5 note scale which can be used in any key for improvisation. Pentatonic scales are the oldest musical scales in the word. Despite the age and history of the pentatonic scale, it is used extensively in modern jazz improvisation.

The most well-known and most used pentatonic scales are the major pentatonic scale and the minor pentatonic scale. The major pentatonic scale uses the chord tones 1 2 3 5 6. The minor pentatonic scale uses the chord tones 1 b3 4 5 b7. As you can see, these two pentatonic scales are actually the same scale starting on a different note.

By contrast, the brighter G pentatonic (in which the C, the darkest note of the C pentatonic, is replaced by the brighter B) is a fine choice for C major improvisation. Yes, in order to contain the five brightest notes of the C major scale, one of the notes it omits is C, the root itself.

A pentatonic scale doesn't work like a “normal” scale and the patterns. Therefore patterns can produce interesting groups of notes and interval structures. In many ways this is what probably makes it such a common device in modern jazz. It is a source of new interesting melodies to work with.

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
