Before this diagnosis, Gilman had written about euthanasia and right-to-die issues. In one passage from her posthumously published autobiography The Living of Charlotte Perkins Gilman (1935), she remarks after visiting her ill father in a sanitarium that a future civilized society would not "maintain such a horror." In 1935, after living three years with a cancer she had been told would kill her within a year and a half, Gilman ended her life by inhaling chloroform.

Gilman died on August 17, 1935, in Pasadena, California - she ended her own life by taking an overdose of chloroform. Her autobiography, The Living of Charlotte Perkins Gilman (1935), appeared posthumously. Gilman's mystery novel, Unpunished, was not published during her lifetime, but appeared in 1997 in The Feminist Press.
