The prenatal human cranium deals with the development of the human cranium before birth. It is divided into two parts, one focusing on normal development and the other on pathologic development. In a systematic, atlas-like section on normal development, an account is given of where, when and how bone development takes place both within the individual bones and as regards the developmental sequence among the bones.

Most of the discussions about human skull base development studies are centered around prenatal changes in SBA. By using 3D ultrasound, it was possible to obtain serial measurements during normal fetal development and to establish a small but significant flexion of the cranial base during the second half of gestation.

Three-dimensional sonography of prenatal skull base ...

·Skull bones are seen all around with normal shape of the skull · Biparietal diameter (BPD) and Head Circumference (HC) correlates with the gestational age and other fetal measures. The above 2 points exclude most skull anomalies and hydrocephalus.. Cranium is checked for structures from anterior to posterior:

Obstetric Ultrasound Scan of the fetal head and cranium

Fetal facial and cranial suture examinations were found to be normal in 20 cases, in which normal babies were delivered at term as confirmed by postnatal pediatric examination. Prenatal diagnosis of craniosynostosis was made in four cases.

Microcephaly most often occurs because of failure of the brain to grow at a normal rate. Skull growth is determined by brain expansion, which takes place during the normal growth of the brain during pregnancy and infancy Microcephaly can be classified into two categories: microcephaly without associated anomalies and microcephaly with associated malformations.

Abnormal skull findings in neural tube defects

Fetal brain showed normal vascular pattern on color Doppler scan (Fig. 5). No other fetal anomaly was seen. Facial structures were normal. The fetus showed normal cardiac activity (137 beats/min) with normal rhythm. The movements of the fetal body parts were normal and well coordinated. Placenta was anterior in position and was of normal thickness.

The smallest circumference, corresponding to the plane of the suboccipitobregmatic diameter, is 32 cm. The bones of the cranium are normally connected only by a thin layer of fibrous tissue that allows considerable shifting or sliding of each bone to accommodate the size and shape of the maternal pelvis. This intrapartum process is termed molding.

Microcephaly is a condition where the head (circumference) is smaller than normal. Microcephaly may be caused by genetic abnormalities or by drugs, alcohol, certain viruses, and toxins that are exposed to the fetus during pregnancy and damage the developing brain tissue.

The aim of this study was to elucidate the distribution of nerve growth factor receptor (NGFR) in the prenatal human pituitary gland until 21 weeks of gestation. Eight fetuses, with gestational ages from 13 to 21 weeks, were examined. The midaxial tissue block from the cranial base, including the pituitary gland and the sella turcica, was excised from the fetuses.

Usually the cerebellum and brainstem are formed normally. An infant with hydranencephaly may appear normal at birth. The infant's head size and spontaneous reflexes such as sucking, swallowing, crying, and moving the arms and legs may all seem normal.
