Woccon Indians. A small tribe formerly inhabiting east North Carolina, related linguistically to the Catawba, hence of Siouan stock. All that is known of them is recorded by Lawson, who states that about 1710 they lived 2 leagues from the Tuscarora on the lower Neuse in 2 villages, Yupwauremau and Tooptatmeer, having 120 warriors.

Of more immediate interest is the fact that Lawson's book contains a short vocabulary of 143 items in the Woccon language, along with vocabularies of 186 items in Tuscarora and 37 items in Pamlico.

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
