Wastewater Treatment Division - King County

The amazing treatment system that cleans our wastewater consists of: over 6,000 miles of sewer pipes; 135,000 sewer catch basins; over 495 permitted outfalls for the discharge of Combined Sewer Overflows; 95 wastewater pumping stations that transport it to 14 wastewater treatment plants located throughout the 5 boroughs.

Wastewater Treatment System - DEP

The Wastewater Treatment Department is composed of the Water and Wastewater Treatment Superintendent and eight employees, and is responsible for the treatment of wastewater prior to discharge to Corpening Creek. The department also maintains wastewater pump stations.

Wastewater treatment The major aim of wastewater treatment is to remove as much of the suspended solids as possible before the remaining water, called effluent, is discharged back to the environment. As solid material decays, it uses up oxygen, which is needed by the plants and animals living in the water.

All wastewater must receive treatment to protect human health and aquatic life. Wastewater is treated at regulated facilities called Wastewater Treatment Plants (WWTP). There are more than 600 WWTPs in Washington. Each plant's discharge must meet our water quality standards.

Wastewater Systems Each day, ENV collects approximately 110 million gallons daily (mgd) of wastewater from the toilets, sinks and drains from homes and workplaces on Oahu. Through a system of 2,100 miles of pipeline, assisted by gravity and 72 pump stations, the wastewater is delivered to nine wastewater treatment plants, which are spread over the island and either owned or operated by the City and County of Honolulu.

Florida statutes require anyone who operates a drinking water treatment plant, domestic wastewater treatment plant and/or water distribution system must be licensed by DEP. To qualify for licensure, an applicant must meet minimum educational and work experience requirements for each class of license.
