The Wellington City Walk consists of 17 sculptures all within a 3km area. The terrain is mostly flat and we suggest giving yourselves 2 hours to finish the full walk. The walk begins at Seismic, by Louise Purvis, and finishes at Nga Kina, by Michel Tuffery. The walk takes you past the Parliament precinct, up the Terrace and dropping down onto Lambton Quay from Woodward Street, along Lambton Quay and through the central city, up and down Cuba Street then back along the Wellington Waterfront ...
